CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 1
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT CREATING THE TEXAS RAIL RELOCATION AND IMPROVEMENT FUND AND AUTHORIZING GRANTS OF MONEY AND ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS FOR FINANCING THE RELOCATION, REHABILITATION, AND EXPANSION OF RAIL FACILITIES.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 2
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROVIDING THAT MARRIAGE IN THIS STATE CONSISTS ONLY OF THE UNION OF ONE MAN AND ONE WOMAN AND PROHIBITING THIS STATE OR A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THIS STATE FROM CREATING OR RECOGNIZING ANY LEGAL STATUS IDENTICAL OR SIMILAR TO MARRIAGE.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 3
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT CLARIFYING THAT CERTAIN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A DEBT.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 4
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT AUTHORIZING THE DENIAL OF BAIL TO A CRIMINAL DEFENDANT WHO VIOLATES A CONDITION OF THE DEFENDANT'S RELEASE PENDING TRIAL.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 5
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ALLOWING THE LEGISLATURE TO DEFINE RATES OF INTEREST FOR COMMERCIAL LOANS.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 6
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO INCLUDE ONE ADDITIONAL PUBLIC MEMBER AND A CONSTITUTIONAL COUNTY COURT JUDGE IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE STATE COMMISSION ON JUDICIAL CONDUCT.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 7
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT AUTHORIZING LINE-OF-CREDIT ADVANCES UNDER A REVERSE MORTGAGE.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 8
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROVIDING FOR THE CLEARING OF LAND TITLES BY RELINQUISHING AND RELEASING ANY STATE CLAIM TO SOVEREIGN OWNERSHIP OR TITLE TO INTEREST IN CERTAIN LAND IN UPSHUR COUNTY AND IN SMITH COUNTY.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 9
THE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATURE TO PROVIDE FOR A SIX-YEAR TERM FOR A BOARD MEMBER OF A REGIONAL MOBILITY AUTHORITY.

PROPOSITION NO. 1
EMINENT DOMAIN
SHALL ARTICLE I, SECTION 1.06, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO REMAIN CONSISTENT WITH STATE LAW, BUT DISCOURAGE THE TAKING AND CONVEYANCE OF PROPERTY TO A PRIVATE PERSON OR ENTITY FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES?

PROPOSITION NO. 2
COUNCILMEMBER TERM OF OFFICE
SHALL ARTICLE III, SECTIONS 3.01 AND 3.03, AND ARTICLE V, SECTION 5.02, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT ALL MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL WILL SERVE A TERM OF THREE YEARS, WITH A MAYOR AND THREE COUNCILMEMBERS BEING ELECTED FOR A THREE YEAR TERM IN 2006 TO THE OFFICES FOR WHICH THE CURRENT TERM OF OFFICE EXPIRES IN 2006, AND THREE COUNCILMEMBERS BEING ELECTED IN 2007 FOR A THREE YEAR TERM TO THE OFFICES FOR WHICH THE CURRENT TERM OF OFFICE EXPIRES IN 2007?

PROPOSITION NO. 3
RESIGN TO RUN
SHALL ARTICLE III, SECTION 3.04, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT IF AN INCUMBENT MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL ANNOUNCES AS A CANDIDATE FOR ANY OTHER ELECTIVE OFFICE SUCH ANNOUNCEMENT SHALL BE A RESIGNATION FROM THE OFFICE THEN HELD BY SUCH MEMBER OF THE CITY COUNCIL?

PROPOSITION NO. 4
MAYOR
SHALL ARTICLE IV, SECTION 4.01, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT EITHER THE MAYOR OR THE CITY MANAGER MAY SIGN APPROVED CONTRACTS, AND TO DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE MAYOR SUBMIT AN ANNUAL BUDGET IN ADDITION TO THE BUDGET REQUIRED TO BE SUBMITTED BY THE CITY MANAGER?

PROPOSITION NO. 5
DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES
SHALL ARTICLE IV, SECTION 4.04, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROHIBIT ONLY THOSE PERSONS THAT ARE RELATED TO THE CITY MANAGER OR A MEMBER OF THE CITY COUNCIL, FROM BEING CITY EMPLOYEES?

PROPOSITION NO. 6
AMENDMENT OF BUDGET
SHALL ARTICLE IV, SECTION 4.06(E) OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PERMIT THE COUNCIL TO AMEND THE BUDGET TO TRANSFER BUDGETED FUNDS FROM ONE FUND OR DEPARTMENT TO ANOTHER, BY MAJORITY VOTE?

PROPOSITION NO. 7
PLANNING COMMISSION
SHALL ARTICLE X, SECTION 10.04, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO REQUIRE A SEVEN MEMBER PLANNING COMMISSION, WITH MEMBERS SERVING STAGGERED TERMS OF OFFICE THAT ARE FOR THE SAME NUMBER OF YEARS AS THE TERMS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL; PROVIDING THAT EACH MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL IS ENTITLED TO NOMINATE ONE MEMBER; AND PROVIDING THAT THE PLANNING COMMISSION MEMBERS MUST BE APPOINTED BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE CITY COUNCIL?

PROPOSITION NO. 8
RUN-OFF ELECTIONS AND TERM OF OFFICE
SHALL ARTICLE V, SECTIONS 5.11 AND 5.12, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE FOR REQUIRED RUN-OFF ELECTIONS TO BE HELD ON THE THIRD SATURDAY FOLLOWING THE CANVASS OF VOTES FOR THE CITY COUNCIL ELECTION, AND TO PROVIDE FOR WINNING CANDIDATES TO TAKE OFFICE ON A SPECIFIED DATE THAT FOLLOWS THE CANVASS OF VOTES FOR THE ELECTION?

PROPOSITION NO. 9
ACTING CITY MANAGER
SHALL ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7.02, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PERMIT THE CITY MANAGER TO DESIGNATE AN EMPLOYEE TO SERVE AS ACTING CITY MANAGER DURING THE ABSENCE OF THE CITY MANAGER, AND RETAIN THE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY COUNCIL TO APPOINT AN ACTING CITY MANAGER DURING TIMES WHEN THE CITY MANAGER IS SUSPENDED OR THE POSITION IS VACANT?

PROPOSITION NO. 10
PERSONNEL POLICIES AND JOB DESCRIPTIONS
SHALL ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7.03, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT, IN ADDITION TO THE CITY MANAGER, THE CITY COUNCIL APPROVE THE JOB DESCRIPTION OF EVERY EMPLOYEE?

PROPOSITION NO. 11
COUNCIL APPROVAL OF DEPARTMENT HEADS
SHALL ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7.04, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT CITY COUNCIL APPROVAL IS NOT REQUIRED FOR THE CITY MANAGER TO TERMINATE A DEPARTMENT HEAD?

PROPOSITION NO. 12
DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENTS
SHALL ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7.05, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO PROVIDE THAT THE CITY MANAGER MAY ADD TO OR MODIFY THE DUTIES OF A DEPARTMENT, IN A MANNER NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE CHARTER?

PROPOSITION NO. 13
POLICE DEPARTMENT
SHALL ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7.06, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO RETAIN THE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY MANAGER TO REVIEW THE ANNUAL EMPLOYEE EVALUATIONS OF ALL POLICE OFFICERS, AND DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE EVALUATIONS OF ALL POLICE OFFICERS BE SUBMITTED TO THE COUNCIL FOR REVIEW?

PROPOSITION NO. 14
FIRE DEPARTMENT
SHALL ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7.07, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO RETAIN THE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY MANAGER TO REVIEW THE ANNUAL EMPLOYEE EVALUATIONS OF ALL PAID FIRE FIGHTERS, AND DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE EVALUATIONS OF ALL FIRE FIGHTERS BE SUBMITTED TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR REVIEW?

PROPOSITION NO. 15
MUNICIPAL COURT
SHALL ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7.11, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO RESTATE THE CURRENT PROVISIONS PROVIDING FOR THE MUNICIPAL COURT, AND TO REMOVE WORDING THAT IS INCONSISTENT WITH STATE LAW?

PROPOSITION NO. 16
ANNUAL CITY BUDGET
SHALL ARTICLE VIII, SECTION 8.04, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO ELIMINATE SOME REQUIREMENTS FOR NARRATIVE STATEMENTS, ELIMINATING THE REQUIREMENT FOR A WRITTEN STATEMENT OF THE REASONS FOR EVERY INCREASE OR DECREASE IN ANY ITEMIZED LINE ITEM EXPENDITURE PROVIDED FOR IN THE BUDGET, REDUCING FROM FIVE YEARS TO TWO YEARS THE TIME PERIOD FOR WHICH THE BUDGET MUST STATE THE TAX LEVIES, RATES AND COLLECTIONS, AND CLARIFYING PROVISIONS TO PROVIDE THE BUDGET WILL ESTIMATE THE REVENUES FROM TAXES BY CATEGORY RATHER THAN STATE THE SPECIFIC AMOUNT OF SUCH REVENUES THAT WILL BE RECEIVED FOR EACH CATEGORY?

PROPOSITION NO. 17
ADMINISTRATION OF THE BUDGET AND BORROWING OF FUNDS
SHALL ARTICLE VIII, SECTIONS 8.06, 8.08 AND 8.11, OF THE CITY CHARTER BE AMENDED TO BE CONSISTENT WITH STATE LAW, AND REQUIRE COMPLIANCE WITH STATE LAW FOR THE BORROWING AND REPAYMENT OF FUNDS?

DEPOSITORY
